1. Chinese New Year Decorations

4. Fire Safety Talk

The Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) conducted a Fire Safety Talk for STL staff on 11 February 2026, as part of ongoing efforts to strengthen workplace safety and emergency preparedness. The session provided valuable insights into fire prevention measures, common fire hazards, and the appropriate actions to take in the event of a fire.

A key highlight of the programme was the live demonstration on the proper use of fire extinguishers. Staff were guided through the correct techniques and safety precautions, with many participants gaining hands-on experience for the first time.
